Learn how you can add an atmosphere of competition and excitement to instruction through competitive games using the websites Kahoot and Quizlet. Quizlet also provides 24/7 self-study opportunities for your students with electronic flashcards that you create or that have been created by other teachers world-wide. Both Kahoot and Quizlet are suitable for all class types-NOT just ESL. If you use multiple choice tests and quizzes for review or testing, you can use Kahoot and Quizlet as alternative study and review methods.

Future workshops being planned include using an electronic white board (e.g. Smart Board or Promethean Board), more suggestions for using laptops, iPads and the computer lab, and introduction to other included components of the Burlington English software.
