NVOC Student Successes



It has been two years since Clay Lacy Aviation established the \$10, 200 Annual Clay Lacy Scholarship Fund for the Aircraft Mechanics students at North Valley Occupational Center (NVOC). The Clay Lacy scholarship initiative provides funds toward tuition, tools and FAA exam fees for students attending the NVOC Aviation Center located at Van Nuys Airport.

Through much investigation Ms. Elizabeth Peñuela, Assistant Principal and the instructors at the NVOC Aviation Center, have been working together to follow up with the scholarship recipients. She is happy to share that out of the twenty-four 2015 Clay Lacy scholarship recipients, thirteen students are working for aviation companies including, Able Air Inc., Zetta Jet Aviation, JPL, Scaled Composites, General Autonomic, Delta Airlines, Fed Ex, Avsource Airlines and Channel Islands Aviation. Nine students are still at NVOC finishing their studies as Aviation Mechanics.

Many of the students will be sharing their individual success stories during the following months with NVOC. Nick Lucero, one of the 2015 Clay Lacy scholarship recipient shared with Ms. Peñuela that he was hired soon after he passed his FAA exam which he took shortly after graduating in October of 2016. Delta Airlines and Jet Propulsion Laboratory (JPL) extended Mr. Lucero employment offers in addition to two other major airlines. After considering all of his options, he chose to work for JPL. Nick stated that, "This outcome of job marketability was a direct result of the excellent skill set I acquired at the North Valley Occupational Center Aviation Center campus and the financial help I received from Clay Lacy Aviation."

NVOC is excited and grateful for the second year of Aviation Mechanics scholarships provided by Clay Lacy Aviation.
