CASAS/WIOA Updates

Academic Teachers:

Please continue to pretest any new students and submit their entry/test forms to our office within 24 hours. Our next round of CASAS testing will tentatively begin in two weeks.

ESL Teachers:

CASAS testing (pretest for new students and posttest for returning students) starts this week.

- Week 1, Feb.13-17: Entry form completion and Testing.
- Week 2, Feb. 21-24: Make-ups (keep in mind that Monday, Feb. 20 is a holiday).
- All entry/test forms are due back in the WIOA Office by Friday, February 24.
- Some of your test record forms (brown side) may have Box 4 crossed out; these students have already attained a payment point (congratulations!!!). They will only need to complete the entry form (blue side).
- Instructions and additional information on how to properly complete forms have been enclosed in your class folder.
- CASAS and EL CIVICS payment points can <u>only</u> be allocated when all 4 of the following forms have been submitted: Entry (blue), Pre-test and Post-test (brown), and Update (green).

NVOC Success Stories

Mr. Bruce Santos works full time as a Licensed Vocational Nursing (LVN) in the Liver Transplant Unit at the Ronald Reagan UCLA Medical Center. He personifies the idea that one person can make a difference. Bruce has touched the lives of countless people he has come in contact with either as an LVN or through the program he started feeding homeless people.

Bruce started his journey to serve others at North Valley Occupational Center (NVOC). At 19 years old, he decided to apply to the LVN program at NVOC because it was the only program that his family could afford. To his disappointment, Bruce was not selected as one of the 20 regular LVN students nor the 5 alternative students that year. He did not let this hurdle discourage him from his goals instead he enrolled in the other Health Occupations offered at NVOC. He completed the Emergency Medical Technician program, the Certified Nursing Assistant program and the Pharmacy Technician program so that he was the best prepared candidate for the LVN program. Bruce Santos reapplied to the LVN program, he was selected as an alternate twice because of the competitive selection process. He eventually was accepted as a regular three years after he initially submitted his application.

Meeting NVOC's LVN Instructor, **Ms. Carol Govier**, changed his life. He shared that she "was more than an instructor, she was a mentor and like a second mother to me. To this day, I hear her voice in my head when I'm at work with a patient." Additionally, Bruce has credited his success to the NVOC administrators who supervised the program and supported each student during the program. He remembered that **Ms. Stephanie Lewis**, Assistant Principal "had my back, through the two years that I was at the school working my way up to get to the LVN program. He also mentioned that **Mr. Dominic Shambra**, Assistant Principal "kept me in line to make sure I wasn't failing any tests."

Bruce Santos will be forever grateful for the opportunities that he has received as a result of his education and training at North Valley Occupational Center. He was hired by Temple Community Hospital in Los Angeles soon after completing the LVN program and passing the National Council Licensing Examination (NCLEX). Since being



employed by UCLA Medical Center in 2011, he met his wife, started a family and is currently working towards earning his Bachelors in Science of Nursing.
