# LAUSD & Social Media





The Los Angeles Unified School District is committed to providing a safe and secure learning and working environment for its students, employees and associated persons. Additionally, LAUSD encourages positive relationships between students, employees and associated persons. While the District recognizes that during non-work hours employees and students may participate in online social media, blogs, and other online tools, District employees and associated persons should keep in mind that information produced, shared and retrieved by them may be subject to District policies and is a reflection of the school community.

The use of social media may have many instructional benefits but when social media postings violate the law or District policies or create a substantial disruption to the school community and/or work environment, the administrator may have an obligation to respond and take appropriate action, including but not limited to investigation and possible discipline.

There is a distinction between being supportive of students and the real or perceived breach of confidentiality or misconduct. Employees and all associated persons who work with or have contact with students are expected to follow all District policies, BUL-999.10, Responsible & Acceptable Use Policy (RAUP) For District Computer Systems and BUL-5167.0 Code of Conduct with Students— Distribution and Dissemination Requirement Policy when using social media as a form of communication.

# **Household Appliances in the Classrooms**



California Code of Regulations and Board Rule 2351 mandate that the District maintain a safe and healthy workplace for employees. Unauthorized use of certain appliances and electrical devices can result in fire danger and impact instruction or operations.

Household electrical appliances are not approved for use in classrooms unless the course curriculum requires such appliances for food preparation or science courses. Other instructional uses for these appliances in classrooms will be permitted only by written authorization of the Site Administrator. Household electrical kitchen appliances shall be limited to designated kitchens, food preparation areas or break rooms in office environments.

Please refer to BUL-6436.0, Safe Use of Household Electrical Appliances and Extension Cords at Schools and Offices, for complete details regarding the District policy on household appliances (such as coffee makers, microwave ovens, toaster ovens, minirefrigerators) in the classroom.


#### New WIOA Technology Workshops
