Ms. Viking Valiente is a North Valley Occupational Center student attending the East Valley Skills Center campus. She started adult school at NVOC in the fall of 2016 because she had been laid off from work. She thought that it would be the perfect time to go back to school. Her teacher, Ms. Oranut Pliansinchai, in the Reading Program encouraged her to pursue her high school diploma and suggested to she speak

to a counselor. After having her transcript evaluated, she was thrilled to find out that she only needed a computer class to graduate!

While completing the Reading Program, Viking enrolled with WorkSource Center to start a job retraining program. As a result of completing the Reading program and for improving her reading skills, the WorkSource was able to help her get accepted to the LA Valley Community College Biotech Program. Viking started the Biotech Program in January of 2017 and graduated on March 8, 2017. Since then, she had interviewed with Grifols, a Los Angeles based pharmaceutical/chemical company, and has been invited to a second interview. She is looking forward to the employment opportunity and starting her new career in pharmaceutical research.

In the meantime, Viking is finishing her final course to earn her high school diploma at East Valley Skills Center. She is scheduled to graduate this June. After DACE, Viking is excited about continuing at LA Valley College in fall as part of the LA Promise Program. She will be majoring in Biological Sciences.
