The 2nd round of WIOA Technology Workshops was held on March 22, 2017 at NVOC. The workshop was focused on learning about the new Promethean ActivePanel. This new type of interactive

classroom presentation and instructional board offer students a learning experience that is reflective of how they are learning in the "Real World." Using technology in the classroom is nothing new but learning how to use it effectively had always been the challenge. Indeed, this may be a semester in which a teacher (or teachers) who demonstrates high enthusiasm, interest, and motivation for having such an instructional tool in their classroom may lead us to the next level of instruction. The plan is for teachers to experiment with lessons using the ActivePanel in the computer lab.

Kudos to **Mr. Barry Bakin**, WIOA Instructional Technology Teacher Advisor, for arranging with Mr. Bryson Bregen of Promethean to Ioan NVOC a 70" ActivePanel for teachers to use in their classrooms in addition to the smaller one that we already have. Currently, WorkSource of Sun Valley is the only application site for TLH in the San Fernando Valley. Additional recruitments at EVSC are in the works and dates will be announced in classrooms soon.

Federal Aviation Administration in Airframe and Powerplant license can enroll at NVOC's Machinist Trainee program or Aviation Mechanics programs.



Last Tuesday, the students in these programs had the opportunity to learn how these two industries have plenty in common. **Mr. Dave Bowerman**, Powerplant Trainee instructor, approached **Mr. Armando De La Torre**, Machinist Trainee instructor, about

creating a Concentricity Gauge. This is one of many important tool used in the Aviation industry to inspect crucial parts of a jet engine. The pieces machined from our state-of-the-art CNC machine produced was accurate and precise to the specifications given.

The visit was very productive for the reason that curiosity in the programs have been sparked amongst the students in both programs. Some machinist students have expressed interest in enrolling into the Aviation Mechanics program after they complete their program and vice-versa. Future projects have been discussed by both instructors and we look forward to strengthening the learning collaboration between our programs.

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


2017 NVOC Job Fair

About eleven months ago our city partners asked the Division of Adult and Career Education to participate in the Targeted Local Hire (TLH) program with the City of Los Angeles. One of the primary requests was that DACE provide soft skills training to those applicants who do not have the necessary employability skills (soft skills). To that end, a Soft Skills Course was created by our Curriculum and Instruction Unit. This is an ESL Intermediate High/ Advanced program which is divided into two 30 hour courses.

In anticipation of being able to meet the needs of our city partners, DACE would like to open up participation to all instructors credentialed in ESL to teach this new course. Interested teachers will need to complete the Teacher Academy for Soft Skills Instruction, which is comprised of four sessions with each one covering different material.
