Besides the beautiful country they were fortunate to see, they also had the experience of dodging a few thunderstorms: a common skill developed by pilots when flying small aircraft around the Midwest United States in the Summer. The aircraft is a 2 place side-by-side aircraft that Mr. Holyoke built from a kit. It cruises at over 200 MPH and burns around 8 gallons of fuel per hour.
