

Apply for Financial Aid

The free Application for Federal Student Aid is available for the 2018-2019 school year beginning today, October 1. Here are some tips to be successful in applying. **First**: Everyone should file a FAFSA. Every student who is considering college next year should fill out the FAFSA. Second: Get organized. Create a FSA ID, and gather your 2017 tax return and W-2 forms and current bank Third: Pay close attention to various deadlines, and submit the form as early as possible. California Dream Act Application is available as an alternative means to pay for college education in California for eligible undocumented students. Undocumented students should complete the California Dream Act application at caldreamact.org.
