On March 12, 2018, all District employees were enrolled in a mandatory MyPLN course titled Suicide Prevention and Awareness. The deadline to complete and pass the assessment for this course is Wednesday, May 23, 2018. If you have not completed the training, you will get a reminder. This online course includes an overview of warning signs and risk factors for suicide and self-injury, as well as information and resources for how to support students in crisis. Instructional Technology Professional Development Workshops for April

Burlington English User Group Friday, April 20th at NVOC room 102 12:45 p.m. to 2:45 p.m.

Matthew Huffine of Burlington English will give a refresher and enhancement workshop for all teachers using Burlington English with their students. Now that many of you have been using Burlington English with your students for several weeks if not months, it's time to learn more about the entire suite of programs available and the student management and statistical tracking options available to you as instructors. This workshop is also open to ESL instructors who would like to use Burlington English in future semesters but are not doing so yet. The workshop offers either paid Staff Development Training Rate or Salary Step Advancement hours.

Summer College Seminar at NVOC

NVOC is pleased to offer the Counseling 40: College Seminar course during summer 2018. This course:

- Does not require the college entrance exam
- Provides students 3 units of college credit towards an Associates degree through Los Angeles Mission College (LAMC) while still enrolled at the adult school.
- Can be used towards satisfying the general electives credits required by the community colleges for graduation and to satisfy the Personal and Career Development elective needed for the adult high school diploma
- The course covers an overview of the community colleges, college survival skills including study and test-taking skills, career exploration, and resume writing.

To enroll for the LAMC Summer 2018, interested students complete the following forms in the adult school counseling offices:

- LAMC Online Application Remember to select SUMMER 2018 term. You must print confirmation page. Students need this to get a college ID number.
- 2. K-12 waiver form
- 3. Directory Card

The LAMC outreach representatives will be at NVOC on May $3^{\rm rd}$ and at EVSC campus on April $16^{\rm th}$ and May $7^{\rm th}$. The deadline to turn-in paperwork for the course is **Thursday**, **May 17, 2018**.
