Message from the Principal

e are about one-third into the school year. The first quarter classes have ended and second quarter classes have begun. Whether classes are on a quarter, semester, or year round schedule, our goals to help students meet their goals remains unchanged. We continue to address student attendance patterns and ask ourselves what can we do to help our students? The answers include reviewing attendance, noting patterns, providing quality instruction, and providing student feedback. To build on our strategy and to offer our instructors guidance, we encourage instructors to have "courageous conversations" with students about their attendance. Here are some questions that you can pose to your students.

"You signed up for my class but you have not shown up. What is the reason you have not come to class?"

"You have under 20 hours of attendance in my class but you have not returned to class. What can I do to help you?"

"Can you tell me why you stopped coming to class? How can I improve the classroom experience?"

We call these courageous conversations because we have to be ready for students to reflect and communicate their issues with attending. These conversations may take us out of our comfort zone but they might help us connect with students. They will feel appreciated and that could be a positive message they might need to come back to school.

As always, advisors and administrators are on hand to help instructors review attendance data and prepare talking points.



WIOA Technology Workshop

NVOC teachers were treated to an informative presentation on using Google Forms as an assessment tool by ESL teacher and Technology Boot Camp participant **Nataliya Kuge**l at the most recent WIOA Technology Workshop. Participants were shown how to use the Quiz Template available on Google Forms to create automatically-graded assessments incorporating a variety of question types: multiple choice, true/false, short answer, check boxes and more. In addition to practical pedagogical skills, workshop participation earns "off-the-clock" participants either District Sponsored Training Rate or Step-Advancement Hours.
