Reminders for All Staff

All LAUSD employees are bound by numerous District policies based on State and Federal laws . Attached to the bulletin are some of these reminders in English and Spanish that should be shared with students. These notices are available in other languages through the Educational Equity and Compliance Office of LAUSD at lausd.net.

Non-discrimination Policy:

The District prohibits discrimination, harassment, intimidation and/or bullying based on actual or perceived race or ethnicity, gender/sex (including gender identity, gender expression, pregnancy, childbirth, breastfeeding, and pregnancy related medical conditions), sexual orientation, religion, color, national origin, ancestry, immigration status, physical or mental disability, medical condition (cancerrelated and genetic characteristics), military and veteran status, marital status, registered domestic partner status, age (40 and above), genetic information, political belief or affiliation (not union related), a person's association with a person or group with one or more of these actual or perceived characteristics, or any other basis protected by federal, state or local law, ordinance, or regulation in any program or activity it conducts or to which it provides significant assistance.

Sexual Harassment Policy:

The District prohibits sexual harassment of or by employees, students, or persons doing business with or for the District. Failure to follow this policy is a violation of state and federal law. Any student or employee of the District who believes that she or he has been a victim of sexual harassment should bring the problem to the attention of the school-site administrator or the school's Title IX/Bullying Complaint Manager so that appropriate action may be taken to resolve the problem.
