### **Program Performance CASAS/EL Civics News**

### **CTE Teachers**

 All CASAS entry forms should have been returned to the WIOA office by February 15, 2019.

### **Academic Teachers**

- Please continue to pretest any new students and collect properly completed entry forms.
- This is the second week of CASAS testing. E-testing will be available at NVOC, Rinaldi, North Hollywood and in some classrooms at EVSC.

### **ESL Teachers**

- EL Civics makeup testing will take place this week at NVOC, Rinaldi and North Hollywood. All testing materials must be returned to the WIOA office by February 22<sup>nd</sup>.
- EVSC classes will have an additional week to complete the EL Civics test due to CASAS e-testing.
- CASAS makeup testing will take place this week at EVSC.

### **CASAS e-testing Milestone:**

- All ABE and ASE classes at the NVOC campus continue to pre/posttest students.
- For the first time E-testing for ESL classes was available at all NVOC sites for the first time.
- 309 testing stations, which include desktops, laptops and Ipads, have already been registered for e-testing.
   More stations are currently being registered in academic labs at EVSC.

It is important to acknowledge the critical contribution of a diverse dedicated group of advisors and instructors that made e-testing a reality at all NVOC sites. This project was NOT a one man/woman project. On the contrary, in addition to the Program Performance Advisors, our Instructional Technology Teacher Advisor and technology support, we were very fortunate to receive the support of all ESL advisors, Academic advisors and ESL and academic instructors at all sites. This collaboration mitigated the impact of last-minute computer glitches and other unforeseeable setbacks very typical of significant expansions such as ours. Thank you all.
