SKillsUSA State Champ - One Year Later



ago, NVOC **EMT** student **Amanda** Goldberg became the first NVOC student to earn a SkillsUSA CA gold medal in the First Aid/CPR occupational skills event, and the first state champion from NVOC in SkillsUSA any competitive event since 2008. Amanda went to the


National Leadership Conference and Skills Championships, placing eighth in the nation. After the NLSC, Amanda enrolled at the University of Arizona, pursuing a major in Deaf Studies. Amanda continues her championship ways, having just completed her first year at the Tuscon campus. Amanda made the Dean's List at the College of Education with a perfect 4.0 GPA. She plans to graduate from Arizona and transfer to Gallaudet University in Washington, DC to earn a Master's degree in deaf studies, combining her major with a minor in public health. She intends to work in medical facilities with hearing impaired patients and families. We are proud of the NVOC Alumni who have created new goals after their success at North Valley Occupational Center.

Jon Corey Wins Gold at SkillsUSA

EMT student **Jon Corey** brought the gold medal in the CPR & First Aid competition back to NVOC at the SkillsUSA California State Conference in April. Jon enrolled in the EMT course at North Valley in the fall and joined the SkillsUSA chapter in November. He and two other students represented NVOC at the SkillsUSA Region 3 conference in January, with Jon placing second and moving on to the state competition. At the state competition, Jon's combined written and skills evaluation scores were best in the post-secondary student division, bringing the CPR/FA gold medal back to NVOC. As state champion, Jon will be representing the post-secondary student division at the SkillsUSA National Leadership Conference and Competition in late June.



NVOC advisor **Jonathan Schaeffer** and EMT instructor **Joshua Effle -Hoy** designed and presented the new EMT occupational competition for SkillsUSA. At the state conference in Ontario, Schaeffer and Effle-hoy demonstrated the EMT competition. The student competitors showed their knowledge and skills at four different skills stations, analyzing injuries, severe medical emergencies, and mass-casualty incidents. Special thanks to NVOC students **Nikobe Graves, David Monzon, Servio Escobedo, Jon Corey**, and demonstration teams from Highland High School in the Antelope Valley School District and Eden Area ROP of Hemet who performed occupational skills specific to the EMT profession. SkillsUSA CA will adopt the EMT occupational skills as a competitive event for 2019-2020.
