Census 2020 is Almost Here

In a few months, a nationwide effort will begin to count all those living in the United States. To help with this effort, DACE has launched its Census 2020 Campaign to build knowledge and foster coherence. Its goals are to focus leadership efforts to ensure that all LAUD students and families are counted in Census 2020 and to reach out to other members of the community to participate as well. The 11 DACE schools have identified staff members who will align school resources, such as staff and technology to develop school site census activities. Currently, there are lesson plans and information bulletins available at the wearedace.org website. The main attraction coming soon will be Census Kiosks at every DACE school where community members can opt to input and transmit their census data electronically. Naturally, the lap tops in the kiosks will not record or store a persons information once it is submitted, so using the kioks is safe. The kiosks will be available from March to April.
